Strength for the Day

Ahhh....ctober! Cooler temps, fresh, crisp air, and the foliage, the fall foliage! The colors of the trees are so vibrant in October, and the meteorologists are telling us that because of the dry summer, there will be a beautifully vibrant and early festival of arboreal colors adorning the Iowa countryside. I hope you'll be able to take a Sunday drive around Marion county and feast your orbs!

I also hope you're enjoying our fall congregational-wide sermon series "Take the Flag".

Each week we've been examining a different flag for its meaning and significance to not only Nascar, Indy, and Sprint Car drivers, but to you and me and our race of faith. So far we've talked about the green, yellow, and blue flags. On Sunday October 2 we'll discuss the red flag. And then the black, white, and checkered.

Here's a quick review/preview of each flag's meaning:

The **green flag**, (start) which means go, or start! How do we start our race of faith?

The **yellow flag** (caution) How do we heed God's cautions to us when our life decisions put us in danger?

The **blue flag** (yield) We all run our own race of faith. But it's important that we also respect others, sometimes even "moving over" for their sake.

The **red flag** (delay or stoppage) When life throws us unexpected and unwanted interruptions, how does God help us get the most out of these "stops".

The **black flag** (disqualification) What happens when our own violations or sinful rebellious behavior take us out of the race of faith --- and how does God helps us to get back into the race?

The **white flag** (not surrender! But final lap!) As we head to the finish line of our life of faith, how do we position ourselves and steer according to God's will?

The **Checkered flag** (victory!) If we persevere and finish our race of faith, navigating the hazards and managing the pit stops --- then victory is ours. The question for us on this final day will be "How does God want us to "experience" the victory?

I'm currently studying the red flag for this Sunday's celebration. The red flag signals drivers to stop their race and go their pit area, usually because of rain or some other situation or condition beyond anyone's control. Pit crews are forbidden to work on the cars or do anything to the car to get an advantage during the time in the pit area. But the drivers are permitted to eat and drink something and to talk to their crew chief about new race strategies. *Many drivers say that how they respond to these red flag interruptions waiting in the pit area can actually determine the outcome of the race.*

In addition to the red flag times of waiting in the pit area, regular pit stops are still a necessary part of auto racing. Drivers know that they cannot possible run an entire race on a single tank of gas and single set of tires.

Friends, in the same way, you and I can't possibly be expected to run our own race of faith without moments when we intentionally pull off the track ---- mid race!

To help provide a mid-race (mid-week) pit stop where we can all refuel, take on some spiritual nourishment, and spend some time talking and listening to God (our crew chief!) consider joining one of the small groups meeting to further discuss the weekly message of Take the Flag. Or volunteer to help with our mid-week children ministries, or gather with other Christians to use your heart, hands, and voices in praising God by making a joyful noise with music. And remember that on the third Wednesday of each month, from 6:25-6:55 p.m., Pastor Brent and Pastor Jamie will hold a prayer service in the chapel. Finally, please remember to make use of the daily devotional material provided to all by our church, The Upper Room!

Friends, I hope and pray that you will plan to experience the added power to your race of faith that can be gained from regularly stopping to engage in the spiritual routines of Sabbath rest, worship, scripture, and prayer.

Christmas Day Camp/ Parents Day Out: December 10th 9am-4pm



Did you know that Montgomery Street Preschool (MSPS) has been a valued ministry of our church for 50 plus years? Starting in the early 1970's as Mom's Morning Out,

the preschool evolved and moved into the church building in the early 80's when the name was changed to Montgomery Street Preschool. It became state licensed in 1993 and moved to its second-floor location in 2003. Montgomery Street Preschool (MSPS) is the only faith-based preschool remaining in Knoxville and is the only 2-year-old preschool program in Marion County. MSPS prides itself on small class sizes with two teachers in each room. Classes are available for 2-, 3-, and 4/5year-olds. Developing the whole child through hands on learning and experiences is what makes MSPS special. Tuition for MSPS pays our teacher salaries. Donations to MSPS, both monetary and items, are always accepted and your church giving can be directed to MSPS. We hope that MSPS will be part of our church for another 50 years or more!

Evidence Provided

"Jesus took Peter and the two brothers, James



and John, and led them up a high mountain. As the men watched, Jesus' appearance changed so that his face shone like the sun, and his clothing became dazzling white. Suddenly, Moses and Elijah

appeared and began talking with Jesus. Peter blurted out, 'Lord, this is wonderful! If you want, let's build three shrines, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

But even as he said it, a bright cloud came over them, and a voice from the cloud said, 'This is my beloved Son, and I am fully pleased with him. Listen to him.' The disciples were terrified and fell face down on the ground.

Jesus came over and touched them. 'Get up,' he said, 'Don't be afraid.' And when they looked, they saw only Jesus. As they descended the mountain, Jesus commanded them, 'Don't tell anyone what you have seen until I, the Son of Man, have been raised from the dead.' His disciples asked, 'Why do the teachers of religious law insist that Elijah must return before the Messiah comes?'

Jesus replied, 'Elijah is indeed coming first to set everything in order. But I tell you, he has already come, but he wasn't recognized, and he was badly mistreated. And soon the Son of Man will also suffer at their hands.' Then the disciples realized he had been speaking of John the Baptist." --Matthew 17:1-13

When I was a child, I often heard the comment, "Prove it." Several children go through a phase when they tend to exaggerate, using their imagination to see some things as larger than life. As adults, some may think to themselves, or even speak out loud the same phrase, prove it, when it comes to discussing Jesus. The question becomes, what kind of proof will you accept? It's pretty difficult to accept any type of proof if you have already made up your mind. We live in a world today of "instant replay" when we need to verify something in the world of sports.

In Matthew's scripture, Jesus had already told the disciples about his death and resurrection. In this mountain top experience, three of his disciples see proof to his claims, and you can imagine how greatly their views changed after seeing Jesu talking with two people who had been dead for generations.

You never know what experience someone will need to accept Jesus. It won't be a transfiguration experience. That has already taken place and is recorded in our Bible. But in 2022, we have over two thousand years of Christian experiences to verify that Jesus is our Savior, the Son of God, who came into our world to teach us, and then to die upon a cross for our sins. There is more than enough evidence to "prove" Jesus' life and purposeful mission. Now, it up for each individual to consider the evidence. It takes an open mind, as the evidence is provided.
