Why, then, are we not outraged about Christians by the millions who live as though God were dead and God's grace were exhausted? Could it be because we live that way so often ourselves?"

The good news we share with one another is the gospel's declaration that no matter where we are in life, we are the recipients of God's limitless grace. Follow the Leader



One day as Jesus was walking along the shores of the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother, Andrew, fishing with a net, for they were commercial fishermen. Jesus called out to them, "Come, be my disciples, and I will show you how to fish for people!" And they left their nets at once and went with Jesus. Farther up the shore, Jesus saw James and John, the sons of Zebedee, in a boat mending their nets. Jesus called to them, and immediately they left their father in the boat with the hired men and followed Jesus. --Mark 1: 16-20

As a child, in our one room country school, we would play follow the leader. It was kinda like Simon says. And I have seen a few sprint car races where a car gets out front, and the rest of the race is "follow the leader."

In this scripture, Jesus calls us to follow him. I can't think of a better leader to follow. We need to remember that these four men had heard of Jesus, maybe they had even been among the crowds that Jesus was teaching. Your decision will affect your family life, your career, and how you cope through all of life's challenges. Deciding to follow Jesus will also impact your money and time management, and your relationships with others. Deciding to follow Jesus leads us to the checkered flag in our life, to the resurrection of Jesus. At the finish line, we find hope amidst pain, suffering and despair.
