

Branding Updates:

East Fellowship Hall is now called Kids Kingdom. It is designed as our main meeting space for activities and events for kids ages 3 through 5th grade. This is still a multipurpose space and can be reserved for other groups or activities. Our newly remodeled space is bright and welcoming.

West Fellowship Hall is now simply called Fellowship Hall.

The Choir Room will now be referred to as the Music Room as it is home to all of our music ministries including Chancel choir and bell choir when in session.

The room at the back of the hallway on the East side of the basement is the Education Center and is a great meeting place for a group of 12 people or less.

The Recreation room is the Youth Room and is home to our Living Way Youth Group. This room is reserved for church use only.

Kids Quest is our new ministry name that will cover all events and activities for kids ages 3 through 5th grade. This includes activities such as Children's Church, Day Camps, and more. These activities will still keep their names, but will fall under the Kids Quest umbrella.

Pathfinders is the name for our 3rd-5th grade group which meets twice a year for 6-7 weeks each session.

Living Way Youth is the name for our Youth Group encompassing $6^{th} - 12^{th}$ graders. The youth selected this name out of many for its meaning as they work to be example of living a Christian life.

Strength for the Day



Happy New Year! As we say goodbye to 2022 and step into 2023, let's remember with joy that our God said "Behold, I am making all things new!" The God of love has come in the Christ child to make all things new --- years, lives, relationships, careers, outlooks, habits, ministries, even whole congregations!

When the New Year came to the congregation of Israel, it was marked with festive celebration. On New Year's Day, the first rays of the sun, rising over the Mount of Olives, shone in a

straight line through the outer eastern gate of the Temple, then on across the Temple Court and over the great altar inside, between the two pillars on either side and on down the long corridor into the Holy of Holies, the sacred recess at the western end. These first rays of New Year's Day were called the "radiance of God" and symbolized God's entrance into the sanctuary, renewing God's covenant with the people. Just at this moment, the shofar or ram's horn would be sounded, and the procession would begin, saying for the people that God would continue to be their God, and that they were still God's people.

The crops may have failed this year, enemies may have threatened or attacked, but it is still God who led the people out of Egypt, God who still sits upon the holy throne reigning over the nations, God who shall be exalted forever and ever. And on this day we see it, because now the light is just right and the past, the present and the future, at least for today, are all ordered in a perfect line.

The Biblical faith suggests that God is the God of the past, the present, and most especially, the future. Time and again in scripture, from Genesis to Revelation, we are reminded that God is continually doing new things. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth", and later, "Behold, I make all things new."

We should not be surprised to see that the God of creation and re-creation will be at work in 2023, at the individual level of our own life, and at the congregational level of our church's life.

The Choir will teach us the joy of the psalms which proclaim "sing a new song to the Lord!" The Finance team will offer us a wonderful way to grow stronger in our marriages as well as our stewardship of the resources God has entrusted to us. New small group Bibles studies will be sharing the good news of God's great love for us and teaching us new ways that we can be better disciples of Jesus Christ. Our

pastoral team will be bringing a new way for adults in our congregation to go on a year-long faith journey with a Confirmation student. And our church staff and leadership teams will be discussing new ways that we can best leverage our resources to minister to the most people in Knoxville and beyond, helping them to become disciples of Christ.

May God bless you as together we enter this New Year. Remember, we serve a mighty God. A God who has created us and called us into a loving and trusting relationship with himself. A God who encourages us, saying "For surely I know the plans I have for you... plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."
