After a month of prayerful discernment over the issue of human sexuality, the Administrative Council met in a special session on Monday evening (2/27) and voted to have our church remain with the United Methodist Church denomination. The vote was 11 to 3, with 1 abstention.

Our congregation will still be able to decide whether or not we will allow same-sex weddings to take place in our church, and whether or not we will accept the appointment of a gay or

lesbian clergy-person to serve as the pastor of Knoxville First United Methodist Church.

During the month of March the congregation is invited to approach any and all Administrative Council members with questions and comments they may have about the vote. The feedback will be brought to the Administrative Council meeting on March 27.

Strength for the Day



It's March! Time for tulips to push their way up through the last of the snow drifts. Time to fly kites on the softening tundra of public parks and school yards. And time for the important spiritual journey of Lent to begin! Lent is the period before Easter when Christians are called to remember, to reflect, and then respond to the greatest love the world has or will ever know --- the love of God as shown through his Son Jesus the Christ. We will look again at the life and teaching of Jesus, and at the events leading up to his arrest and crucifixion. We will silently wait --- and then joyously

celebrate as we run to and see the empty tomb on Easter Morning! And we will share the good news of Easter with others.

What we are describing in our Lenten journey is the "Two Channel Rule of Communication". That is --- if something is important for people to hear ---- it's important for them to see as well. Important news should be communicated both ways.

The Bible is the self-communication of God --- to people --- to you and me. It is the self-revelation of God's mind, God's will, God's purpose and plan ---- and most importantly, God's infinite and relentless love for the world and all of humankind He has created.

The Bible is the quintessential love story in all of history. It's the story of a love so strong that it found expression in creating something and someone to love. Its the story of love lost, spurned, rejected. A story of a pursuing and protecting love, that cares for, and promises to save, the one loved. A love story that can have a beautiful ---or a tragic ending, for each person who reads it.

But we can't stop here. Because we've only talked about one channel of the "two channel rule of communication". Does the Bible --- does the Word of God --- address the other ---- that being if something is important for us to hear, then it's important for us to SEE?

Maybe you've heard the story of the Iowa farmer and his wife sitting one night looking out their picture window during a late winter blizzard at a large group of sparrows who were getting blasted by the wind driven snow and were obviously so disoriented that they didn't know how to find shelter. Knowing they would die if something wasn't done, the farmer braved the storm and clawed his way out to his barn and opened the door for the sparrows to take shelter in. But the sparrows didn't seem to understand and just kept getting blown around his yard. So the farmer went out again and turned on the flood light over the open door, hoping this would attract the sparrows. But it didn't. As the situation grew more desperate, the farmer, out of compassion for the little birds and his frustration with how to save them, blurted out to his wife, "If I could just be a sparrow for one minute, I could go out there and tell those birds to follow me to the barn, and I could save them!"

Which brings us to the Living Word of God.

"En arche hvn ho Logos, kai ho Logos pros ton Theon. Kai ho Logos HVN ho Theos."

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word WAS God."

"And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." (John 1:1, 14)

The farmer did become a sparrow! How's that for the ultimate example of the power of the two-channel rule in communicating a message!

Jesus, the Living Word of God, makes no bones about it. He tells us straight out in the written word, "If you have seen ME, you have seen the Father", because "I and the Father are ONE."

So --- if you want to know what God is like --- his nature, his character, how God thinks and acts towards others

- --- if you want to know how God would have you live your life in relationship to Himself and others ---- **look at how Jesus lived**!
 - --- If you want to know how much you mean to God and how much He loves you ---- **look at how Jesus died!**


Toward that end, you are invited to join with others in a special Lenten journey we began last Sunday, February 26, called The God We Can Know. Together during Sunday worship, we will consider the "I Am" sayings of Jesus found in the Gospel of John. Jesus said of himself, "I Am: The Bread of Life, The Light of the World, The Good Shepherd, The True Vine, The Way, the Truth, and the Life, The Resurrection and the Life."

Friends, I invite you to come and engage with each of these messages and allow them to deepen and inspire your discipleship so that you may not only make your way to the cross on Good Friday, or the empty tomb on Easter Sunday, but journey with the Risen Christ every day and wherever his spirit will lead you.

Good Friday Day Camp - April 7th, 2023 from 9am-12pm


Kids ages 4 through 5th grade will enjoy a fun filled morning learning about the Easter Story.

Update on Recent Events in Moldova

The plan included sabotage and militarily trained people disguised as civilians to carry out violent actions, attacks on government buildings and take hostages [as a way to install] an illegitimate government controlled by the Russian Federation – President Maia Sandu



The resolve of the people of Ukraine has been a true blessing. For most of the world, their fight is a fight for their freedom. But for Moldova, they are a shield that has protected us from physical harm and an armed takeover. My family and I will be forever indebted to the people of Ukraine for this.

At the same time, Moldova has not been immune to Putin's terrorism campaign. Repeated bomb threats, rockets flying overhead and the use of energy resources as a weapon were commonplace until Moldova found a way to adapt and continue on our chosen path. But resist self-determination from a people do not sit well with the man in Moscow.

The past month, plans for an armed coup were uncovered. In particular, armed Russian supporters from Macedonia, Servia and Russia would join in protest organized by Russian supporters in the country, and then begin operations to

takeover government buildings and take key members of the government hostage. There were also plans for Russian troops to potentially land at Chisinau International Airport to help take over the capital. Thankfully, these plans were exposed. Thankfully, the government has been developing a number of contingency plans for many different scenarios, including, if needed the destruction of the only airport in the country capable of handling military plans.

While these are concerning times, they serve to show us who reflects the love of God. We remain grateful for the hard work of so many and the difficult choices being made to keep us safe. We also remain grateful for the love, support, and prayers Columbia gives.
