They simply could not believe in Jesus and remain isolated from each other because the Jesus they believed in lived his life --- with others.

It's no surprise that "community" is part of Jesus' nature. When he began his three year ministry he rounded up some others to walk through life with him.

In the four Gospels, when Jesus is calling his disciples at the beginning of his ministry, have you ever thought about his recruiting strategy? What was his end goal? I mean, since he's God, he could easily have walked down the beach and assembled an army of 12,000 men to overthrow the government by force. He could have called together 1,200 and given them amazing powers. But he didn't do either. In fact, he didn't even call 120. Basically, Jesus just formed the very first "small group," as we call it in the church today. He launched his ministry with 12 people. He put together a tiny community of very diverse and, frankly, mostly unimpressive followers. Why? Well, because Jesus wasn't planning a coup or forming a cult --- He was building a community.

They not only heard teachings about community and how to go about it from Jesus. They saw what community was. And they learned quickly that Jesus was the one who would keep them together.

Jesus is the "why" for anything they did. If you asked them why they met together they would say, "Because Jesus did." If you asked them why they prayed they would say "Jesus did." If you asked them why they forgave each other, they would say "Jesus did."

Community created by a focus on Christ changed their lives. And it can change ours.

Unity will come in community when Jesus is our "why?" Unity in community will happen when we do what he would do in the way he would do it. And Jesus would challenge the status quo of our isolated world --- and create community!

He'd even tell us today to "create habitat for community." I think Jesus is smiling down on our congregation and on our efforts to create an Outdoor Life Center and Pickleball Pavilion --- creating habitat for community to take place!

Friends, the Bible says this in Romans 12:5 "We belong to each other and each of us needs all the others." That's what fellowship is all about. We all need each other.

To properly define biblical community, look no further than the last few syllables in the phrase — "unity." This is both the point and the practice of the whole concept.

So here are three reasons that help answer the WHY of Biblical Community:

#### 1. We fellowship with other believers to keep our relationship with God strong.

Biblical community will, first, keep our vertical connection — our relationship with God — strong. Nothing will hold us accountable and encourage us to follow Jesus quite like other Christ followers.

**2. We fellowship with other believers to keep our relationships with others strong.**Biblical community is also the best way to keep our horizontal relationships on the right and righteous

Biblical community is also the best way to keep our horizontal relationships on the right and righteous path. Other Christians can help us strengthen and increase our ties to both those in the church, and

also outside the church. Together, we can encourage and build each other up inside the body, while praying for and challenging each other to reach out to those who don't yet know Christ.

Hebrews 10:25 "And let us not neglect meeting together, as is the habit of some. Instead let us encourage one another." God's saying, "Hey, I created you for community! I want you to meet together, in part, so you can give and receive the blessing of encouragement to each other through your presence and personality and giftedness.

#### 3. We fellowship with other believers to accomplish God's will on earth.

We help each other serve. Ephesians 2:10 "For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life." God has a purpose for your life and part of that purpose is to work with other believers to accomplish God's will.

Friends, our church is offering many wonderful opportunities to gather with our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the summer months in order to accomplish God's will and strengthen our relationships with each other. Helping with our Children's Day Camps, Vacation Bible School, Conspiracy of Kindness projects, and more are all great ways to experience the blessing of unity in community.

#### SINGLES BIBLE STUDY GROUP




Did you know we have started a singles bible study group? We meet once a month. Next meeting is June 20<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm at the public library.




#### MSPS THANK YOU
