Every Monday morning our church staff begins our weekly meeting with scripture, prayer, and devotional thought, often written by a United Methodist person living almost anywhere in the world.

A while back, a woman from Pennsylvania wrote about struggling with an opportunity to go on a mission work trip. She was anxious about many things ---- the environment of a large urban setting, and her own insecurity about being able to contribute anything to the work of the group. With the encouragement of others, she finally decided to go. But she was still uncertain and afraid.

One day during the week, something happened to change her heart and mind --- and her whole experience! In her own words:

"One day, while we were working at a food pantry, a man showed up with a food truck to be loaded for a delivery route. He handed me the keys, gave me the list of things he needed in the truck, and

said he would be back in an hour. Nervously, I chose my team, and we set to work. When the man returned, his truck was loaded with everything he needed. Later, one of my youth leaders told me

that the man had said that thanks to our help, he was able to deliver food to more people than usual. I felt so proud that I overcame my fear of New York City and was able to lead a team to get stuff done.

That trip was the best experience of my life. I learned that I could make a difference, despite being the least likely person for the job. When I trusted God enough to step out of my comfort zone, I realized that God had chosen me for the task and was with me every step of the way."

Friends, this woman's experience is no different than most Christians'. When we follow Jesus, we will inevitably be brought to opportunities and experiences that we've never done before, and that may even seem daunting. But, if will step out in faith and engage them, participate in them, alone or with others, we'll find that God has called us to that ministry, and is with us every step of the way. Again, remember the prophetic words of Bishop Gregory Palmer: "For those people who will make themselves even reasonably available to God, the Holy Spirit will do amazing things in them, and through them!"

As our fall church programming approaches, August is a good month to ask yourself this important question: Where is God encouraging you to go? To volunteer to help with the youth group or teach Children's Church? To serve on a committee? To invite a neighbor or friend or co-worker to join you and others in a mid-week time of fellowship and discussion of The Story --- a walk-through of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation? To volunteer for a shift at the Outdoor Life Center Concession Window and give a cup of cold water to someone who is thirsty from playing Pickleball? To walk as an adult mentor with a Confirmation student on their faith journey? To find new life as part of a Women's Circle Group or Sunday morning Bible Study. To band together with your brothers in Christ and begin a Men's Ministry Group? Where is God encouraging you to go today?

Friends, as the mission trip participant from Pennsylvania prayed, so do we:

Dear God, help us to step beyond our routines to do your will so that we can shine your light to the world. Amen.

2023 NATIONALS PANCAKES





COUNTING ON YOU

Jesus left the area, and many people followed him. He healed all the sick among them, but he warned them not to say who he was. This fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah concerning Jesus—"Look at my Servant, whom I have chosen. He is my Beloved, and I am very pleased with him.
