STRENGTH FOR THE DAY



I recently read an article from a pastor in Long Beach, California who was asked to be a guest preacher at a historic church in Rome, Georgia. When he arrived on Saturday, he met the host pastor who took him on a tour of his early American church. As they walked through the famous church grounds, he could almost hear the voices of early patriots echoing off the old red brick walls. The church's celebrated history included an

episode that the pastor said he will never forget. During the civil war the church building was used by the Union army as a marshalling area. At a crucial turning point during the war, the Union armies needed supplies. Supply wagons were stopped at the bank of a nearby river without a ferry. In a creative move that rivals any war story, the commanding officer ordered that the wooden church pews be used to float the vital supplies to the starving Union soldiers on the other side of the river. Pews that were meant for sitting were now serving.

That story reminds me that Knoxville First United Methodist Church is also engaged in a battle. It is a spiritual battle for the eternal souls of every living person within our sphere of influence. The Apostle Paul, in his letter to the Ephesians (6:12) reminds us of this unwelcome reality: "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world." The Bible reveals that the church is not a playground but a battleground. In the color and beauty of these soft autumn days of football and falling leaves, it's easy to forget that. To win people for God's kingdom, we need to literally throw everything we have into the fray...our energy, our resources, our time, our talents, our prayers. And if necessary, even our wooden church pews! The apostle Paul spoke of the creative commitment that should adorn the church. "I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings." (1 Cor. 9:22-23)

Knoxville First United Methodist Church is growing --- spiritually, and in ministry. We are sharing in the blessings of the gospel as we witness the transformation of people who are learning to follow Jesus closer than they ever have before in their lives. To keep our growth well supplied we need to stay connected to Jesus who is the Vine (John 15), pray constantly, and stay connected in ministry with one another. 




CHILDREN'S CHURCH

GOD'S STORY . . . OUR STORY



"Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread." Jesus answered, "It is written, one does not live by bread alone." Then the devil showed Jesus all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered, "It is written, Worship the Lord your God, and serve only God." Then the devil took Jesus to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning

you to protect you; and on their hands they will bear you up so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." Jesus answered, "It is said, do not put the Lord your God to the test." When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time." --Luke 4:1-13

The weather forecasters usually warn us before an Iowa thunderstorm or winter blizzard arrives in our area so we can prepare . Sometimes, the weather people get the snow predictions right on target, and sometimes, the extra trip to the grocery store is for naught. If people knew an earthquake was going to occur, people would prepare. But the problem is, earthquakes don't generally provide a warning. In life, many times, temptations appear before us without warning. In God's story, we frequently read about normal people going through temptation. Tempting opportunities present themselves unannounced and generally we are not expecting them. When we are tempted, we can recall this Luke scripture, when Jesus was famished, and the devil tempted him. The devil hoped that he had caught Jesus in a weak moment, and approached Jesus with various temptations. In each case, Jesus was role modeling for us how to respond, applying God's word. One reason Jesus lived among us on this earth so he would understand the temptations that we face in our lives. He knows and understands what we are up against. We are frequently tempted, and when we are, we can recall this example in Luke's Gospel of how Jesus dealt with his temptations. Remember that we don't pass through this life alone. Jesus, his examples, and his teachings, are always with us, we are active in God's story, which is our story. For this, we can lovingly give thanks, as God loves us first. I am truly enjoying studying our story, and I hope that you are also.
