AS YOU READ CHAPTER 7

This week we get to read chapter seven of The Story! We will continue to see how God moves and cares for his people in amazing ways! Use the questions and prayers below to help prompt discussion among your family about the chapter!

1. Do you think people felt silly walking around the walls of Jericho for days? What does this show you about their faith in God?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, we pray that you would help us to follow you no matter what! Remind us you are with us and that you are better than anything when we need it. Amen.

2. They did something that may have felt silly because they did what God told them to. What does this show you about their faith in God?

Prayer: God, we know that your plans are the best for us. Help us to listen to you and follow you even when it seems silly or is difficult. We pray you would help us to surround ourselves with people following you to encourage us when we need it! In Jesus name we pray, Amen!

3. God used Rahab, a woman who had not made good choices in her life, to help His people in a big way. What does this tell you about God?

Prayer: God, thank you for loving us all so much! We know that you created every person and that you love us all more than we can imagine! We pray that you would use us to love and care for others. Amen!

4. Does God forgive past sins?

Prayer: God, we pray that you would forgive us for our sins. Thank you for forgiveness! Help us to remember you when we are tempted to make bad choices. In Jesus name we pray, Amen!

5. What are some ways you can show your faith in God and help others this week?

Prayer: Lord, thank you for all that we can talk as a family about you and all that we can learn from The Story! Thank you for how you have blessed us! Help us to bless others and show them your love! In Jesus name we pray, Amen!
