



Did you Know???

Did you know the Peter Paul & Pickleball started with about 6 people and has grown to 30 people?

Did you know we play year-round?

Did you know we have a Facebook group called Peter Paul & Pickleball?

Did you know that all the improvements made to the Faily Life Center and the courts were funded with, New Ministry Funds and Knoxville City Facade Grants, not the General fund? Did you know:

We have been gathering and playing for 2 1/2 years.

We have a text message system of notification of play times. The group includes people from all parts of Knoxville and the surrounding areas.

It's called a Fresh Expression ministry because it's not held in the church, but outside the walls of the traditional church.

We have played, prayed, grieved, celebrated with each other.

This group, is a church family. They have worked hard to lift each

other up and lend support to each other through the ups and downs of daily life.

We also worked hard to make this sport possible in our community and therefore have been a positive influence in Knoxville!

This group cleaned and painted the interior of the Family Life Center.

We researched, planned, and provided the labor to make the beautiful pickleball courts at 123 S 4th street happen when Knoxville didn't have any pickleball courts.

It was a labor of love and every member of Peter Paul & Pickleball helped in some way.

We applied for the Knoxville Facade grants for businesses around the square and received grants twice to help off set the costs.

We did the applied the brick facade at the family life center, none of us had ever done a project like that and God sent us an angel to help us make it happen and be done right!

We scraped and painted the interior of the Memorial Hall building; we taped the courts off for winter play.

We play in the Memorial Hall in the winter, when it's too cold to play outside.

We play on Sunday, Monday and Thursday, with Monday being for beginners.

This is such a fun group, and we love having new people join us!

SALTY DAWG



We all like a little salt to add flavor to our food. Jesus liked to use salt too. He said, "You are the salt of the earth. But what good is salt if it has lost its flavor? Can you make it useful again? It is no longer good for anything, and will be thrown out and trampled upon underfoot as useless. You are the light of the world, like a city on a mountain, glowing in the night for everyone to see. Don't hide your light under a basket. Instead, put it on a table and let it shine for all. In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father."

--Matthew 5:13-16

Have you traveled to Homer, Alaska? Homer is located on what is called a "spit" which is a long and narrow peninsula. The "Salty Dawg" is a log-cabin

like restaurant/pub on the peninsula. I imagine they have salt on the tables for their food.

Jesus invites us to be the salt and the light in today's world. We pick up the salt shaker and the salt enhances the flavoring of our food. Anyone that's on a restricted salt diet understands the value of it. Our pets need salt. On the farm, our livestock need salt in their diet. Even the grocery stores in my home town in the 1960's used to have salt blocks for sale. Jesus calls us to flavor the world, to "shake" things up a bit, just as he did. My grandparents used salt as a preservative, and Jesus would like us to keep this world from spoiling, from falling further into spiritual decay.

In the same way, Jesus also invites us to be light, to illuminate. Light can also purify, such as the radiation used in cancer and other health situations. Light can be a source of warmth, and we can warm up to others, checking their need for comfort or just a warm welcome. Both salt and light provide goodness in our lives. Jesus Christ brings goodness into our life. Without Jesus, life would be bland, cold, and dark. Just as we need salt and light, we can use some dashes of Jesus in our lives. Pass Jesus around!

October brings cool nights, when a bon fire and roasted marshmallows really hit the spot. In church, we will be following The Walk, with both the sermon series and the small group meeting on Tuesdays. We invite you to remain involved throughout October and continue into the season of Advent. See ya Sunday!
