





GREAT NEWS!

KFUMC has been awarded the 2024 Carma Mohler Grant by the Iowa United Methodist Foundation. "This is awarded to the Blessing Boxes at Knoxville UMC for outstanding dedication to combating hunger within their community"

We applied for the grant with the blessing boxes in mind. We are only able to put shelf stable foods in the boxes. This grant allows us to give non shelf stable foods to families in need.

This grant will be used to purchase an upright freezer that will be used for perishable items that are not sustainable outside in the Blessing Boxes.

These items will be distributed at the meal at the end of the month. These items might be meat or entrees that must stay frozen until use.

The freezer will be purchased locally.



THANKSGIVING



As Jesus entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" When Jesus saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" Then Jesus said to him, "Get up and go on your way, your faith has made you well." --Luke 17:12-19

In our study of The Walk, Pastor Jae reminded us that Jesus taught us to give. Indeed, in this passage of Luke, Jesus gave the gift of ten people returning to their families and enjoying a sense of normalcy within their lives. November ushers in the reminder of our Thanksgiving heritage. We have even set aside a day we call Thanksgiving, to gather with family and friends, share a meal, converse, play some family games, enjoy fellowship, and perhaps watch some football.

Luke reminds us that Jesus can and does heal us. Ten lepers called out to Jesus, praying that He would have mercy upon them and heal them. We learn that all ten were healed, but that only one returned thanks. I believe that Jesus is modeling to us that we don't have to be thanked for helping others. Yes, a simple thank-you would be nice. But Jesus didn't stop his healing nor his ministry because nine out of ten didn't bother to thank Him for his healing. A person this week told me that they were not giving a specific annual gift because last year, they weren't thanked. Jesus might tell that person, "Hey, just because you didn't receive a thank-you doesn't mean you have to stop giving. Why don't you continue with your kindness of helping others." Really, let's not wait for a thank you. Perhaps the other nine lepers that were healed were so happy to be restored that they couldn't wait to get to their loved ones and pick up where they had left off.

In this season of Thanksgiving, and yes, throughout the year, Jesus urges us to continue to give, to heal, and to love. If we receive a thank-you, that's great, but that isn't the reason that we give in the first place.

We will continue to share the message to lovingly give, and to share the message of God's plan of salvation. May God bless each of your activities and may we continue to reach out and bring people to Christ. God bless you, and see you Sunday!
