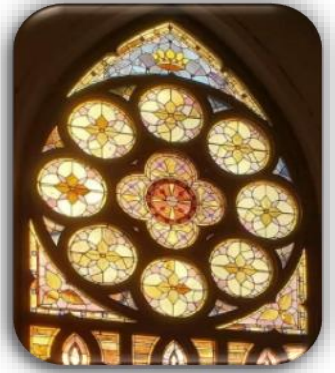

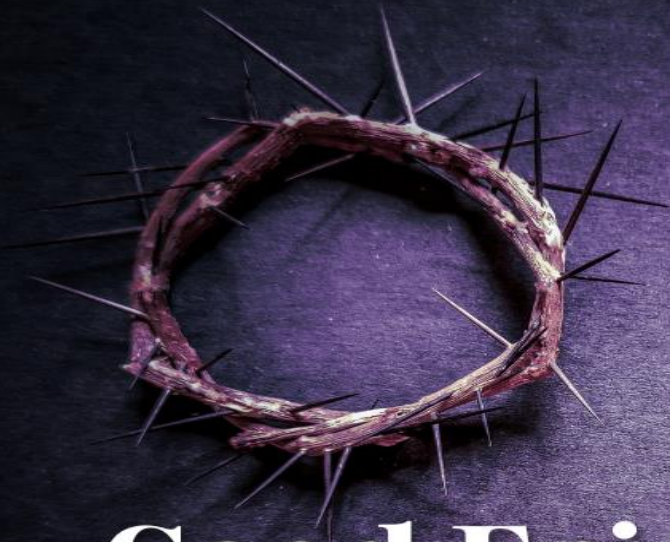

Pop-Up Pantry

We are making a few changes to our Pop-Up Pantry! Both for donations and the way we give items out.

Currently, the Pop-Up Pantry occurs once a month on the first Wednesday. It takes place during the First Wednesday meal. We set up tables just inside the entrance in WFH. We provide items to create a complete meal along with some paper products. Families can browse the available options and take home either a complete meal or part of one. This initiative supports families during challenging times when making ends meet can be difficult. Our goal is to provide enough food to support 15-20 families each month, depending on their size.

In the past, we would bag up all of the ingredients and hand out a bag to each family. What we have found is that some items were discarded because the family didn't like it.

A few benefits to a client choice pantry:

- Increased respect: Offering clients a variety of choice provides a more meaningful service that allows shoppers to tailor their selections based on preferences and cultural or dietary needs.
- Increased dignity: An atmosphere of participation and choice lends dignity to a process that is difficult and humbling for many of our neighbors and friends.
- Refined means of food acquisition: Tracking which food items are in highest demand and which items are left on the shelf helps us know what to buy.
- Increased efficiency: Shoppers leave only with what they have chosen. This creates a more efficient use of limited food resources that will not be wasted or given away.

We are changing our Pop-Up pantry to a client-choice or supermarket-style pantry. We will try to include fresh fruits and vegetables as they become available, making adjustments monthly and seasonally. There are limits based on family size.

As you know we received the Carma Mohler Grant and purchased a freezer for frozen items for the pantry. We look for sales and can store the frozen pantry items until needed.

Here's how the donations will work: we will have a list of needed donations on a cart in the Narthex on Sunday. Take the list to use when you shop. Bring the items back and place them on the cart where you found the list. Please bring fresh fruits or dairy products listed as close to the pantry date as possible to reduce spoilage. Pantry dates are the first Wednesday of each month.

Friday, April 18th, 9am-noon

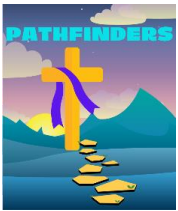

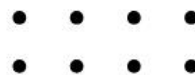

Jesus Was The Resurrection



Martha replied to Jesus, "I know that he will rise in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus said to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though they die."--John 11:24-25

Jesus was and IS the resurrection! He told us that he was the resurrection even before he died and rose again. We are quickly approaching our resurrection Sunday celebration on April 20. The month of April ushers in Palm Sunday on April 13, with our children's play, and on April 17, we worship together at 7 pm during Maunday Thursday, with the choir singing. And then we have Good Friday on April 18. We will have a children's day camp Friday morning and then we will worship at 7:30 Friday evening with a special Drama.

With Jesus' resurrection, we find life, eternal life. And our forgiven and resurrected life can't be separated from God by sin and our eternal life won't be destroyed by death. Jesus told Martha he is already the resurrection and is testifying to the truth that the Son of God indeed holds power over death and eternal life. Both the empty tomb and the cross are testimonials that God's plan of salvation was fulfilled from the very beginning at Bethlehem.

As a church family, I invite you to participate in each of these services. Each has its own purpose and uniqueness and fits into the approaching sacrifice of the Son of God. You will leave each service with a sense of Jesus' experiences just prior to his death, a better understanding of Jesus' passion before he was killed, as an innocent man, upon the cross. And then on the morning of April 20, you will experience the joy and excitement when the empty tomb is discovered, and you can exclaim to another person, "He is risen, He is risen indeed." AMEN.

I so enjoy worshiping with each of you on Sunday mornings. We have a loving atmosphere of encouraging one another, walking with one another, and praying for each other. I enjoy the God moments when we show one another mercy! We adhere to the Biblical principles brought forth by God.
