As one of your Pastors, I also bless you all! May God guide you throughout the year and give you peace and abundance.



Our church will be offering a small group study beginning February 3 using the book *Grief Share*. It is a 13 week study, one hour per week. We will meet on Tuesdays on the lower level from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. We will cover various aspects of the grieving process. Topics include normalcy, the grief journey, self-care, being overwhelmed, questions for God, hope and resilience, among other topics.

Of course, sharing about a lost loved one is a very personal matter. Respecting privacy and keeping discussion within the group will be a necessity.
